## What are you doing on the TJV ?

---

I have been volunteer in the organization team of the Transat Jacques Vabre association for 15 days. I have been working on 2 main missions: the technical organization of the race start day, and the relationship with the partners and sponsors of the event. Having the chance to work on an event of this magnitude was a great experience for me, who didn't really know the world of event management. It allowed me to discover the technical backstage, and especially the crisis management in terms of logistics, and taught me to be reactive and efficient.
