Located in a former military fort, the Jardins Suspendus are an essential place for the people of Le Havre taking strolls and walks.

- From October to March, from 9 am to 5 pm
- Free admission (except on special events)

The conservatories

- From 8th February to 29th March and from 3rd October to 15th November: open on Saturdays, Sundays, and bank holidays, from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm and from 1.45 pm to 5 pm
- From 4th April to 30th September: open every day, from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm and from 1.45 pm to 6 pm

Montgeon Forest Park

Covering over nearly 270 ha (including 30 ha of grass lawns), Montgeon Forest Park is the ideal place to chill out and enjoy nature.

Hikers and athletes will be able to take advantage of the wide open spaces available to them while others will enjoy alternative outdoor leisure activities such as tree climbing and cycling.

A dog park is also available for dogs to play off-leash under the supervision of their owners.

Cap de La Hève

Cap de la Hève offers a breathtaking view on the Côte d'Albâtre and the estuary of the river Seine. From up there, you will be able to see the high cliffs and the Calvados coastline: Deauville, Trouville, Honfleur, and even Caen, when the weather is clear!

Hiking in the area

Château de Gromesnil

Located in Saint-Romain-de-Colbosc, the Château de Gromesnil is surrounded by a wooded park with over 400 century-old trees and a magnificent beech grove.



Now considered as a cultural and environmental landmark, the chateau – and its Renaissance style setting – remains a place of history and an exceptional venue that must be discovered during special events or when you visit the area.

Even though the building dates back to the 16th century, it was renovated at the end of the 19th century, when Louis-René Preverand de la Bourtresse – then owner of the chateau – entrusted one of Viollet-le-Duc's disciples with the construction of two towers and the installation of roof dormers, inspired by the chateaux of the Loire Valley.
